CMRIPS/CAMRT-SK Roadshow

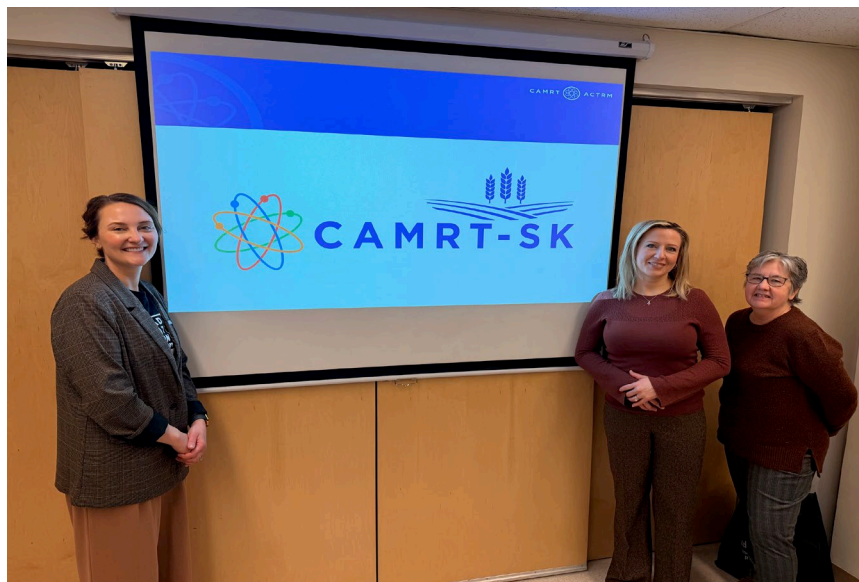
One of the strategic goals for the new 2026-2028 CMRIPS Strategic Plan states that CMRIPS will **"Engage and effectively educate members and stakeholders regarding roles and responsibilities of the College"**.

One of the ways in which this is being accomplished is by partnering with CAMRT-SK in the development of a joint presentation that clearly articulates the CAMRT-SK *association* versus CMRIPS *regulator* roles. This presentation will be delivered to the membership through several sessions, both in-person and virtually throughout the three-year strategic plan cycle.

The first of these sessions was held on March 5, 2026, at the Allan Blair Cancer Centre in Regina. The Saskatoon Cancer Centre staff joined the session virtually. This was a great opportunity to clearly define the areas of responsibility for each organization. More dates are planned in 2026 so watch for communication in the months ahead!

2026-2028 Strategic Plan

The next three-year cycle of the CMRIPS Strategic Plan will be guided by three strategic directions as approved by the CMRIPS Council. Regular updates and progress on each of these strategic goals will be reported to Council as well as being highlighted in the CMRIPS Annual Report.

- 1. The public, CMRIPS, and our stakeholders, are informed and have a clear understanding of the implications, responsibilities, and changes introduced by the new Regulated Health Professions Act (RHPA).**
 - ❖ Ensure regulatory compliance with the RHPA, including required Ministry reporting
 - ❖ Update CMRIPS bylaws to reflect the new legislation
- 2. Engage and effectively educate members and stakeholders regarding roles and responsibilities of the College.**
 - ❖ Provide awareness of roles and responsibilities of CMRIPS
 - ❖ Ongoing collaboration with the CAMRT-SK provincial body
- 3. Review and update standards of practice that embody regulatory excellence including safe and ethical practice.**
 - ❖ Review historical complaints and scope of practice questions
 - ❖ Update Standards of Practice
