



MRT Week November 2-9

As we look ahead to November, CMRIPS would also like to ensure that we include a shout out to our medical radiation technologists. Whether you perform MRIs, CTs, nuclear medicine scans, radiation therapy, or x-rays, we want to celebrate and recognize the unwavering dedication to your profession.

CMRIPS has developed a Jurisprudence Program to ensure that members understand the role of the College as well as the regulatory bylaws that govern its work. As of September 15th, all new initial applicants must complete the course before a license to practice in Saskatchewan is issued. The course will also be offered to existing members as a CE opportunity. Watch for more details and timing on when it will be available in the months ahead!



Annual License Renewal

The window for annual renewals will open on October 15, 2025. Members will have until December 1, 2025 to renew without penalty. Members who do not renew prior to December 1st will be subject to an additional \$100.00 late fee.

In order for your license to auto-renew and without delay, it is important to ensure that you have read the declarations carefully, answered correctly, and make timely payment. The most common issue the CMRIPS staff see during the renewal period is members not answering the PLI declaration correctly. Answering NO in error will prevent your license from auto-renewing and we will have to reach out to you by email to verify your PLI status and manually process the renewal.

You must be able to declare **YES** to the continuing education question. Education credits must have been obtained between December 1, 2024 and November 30, 2025. The only exception to this rule is new graduates who are exempt from the CE requirement in their first year of practice. If you do not have the required number of CE credits, please reach out to the CMRIPS office and we will work with you on a mitigation strategy.

If you will be retiring, and not renewing for 2026, please ensure that you complete a resignation notification to take effect on your last day of work. Click here to review the annual renewal FAQ document.

The CMRIPS staff will be available throughout the renewal period to answer any questions.

Spotlight on Continuing Education

CMRIPS receives several emails throughout the year requesting confirmation about whether an activity qualifies for continuing education credits.
